
Central America began as a segment of land and multiple countries put together with Mexico called Mesoamerica



NATIONAL MALL

The National Mall is home to more than 26 miles of pedestrian sidewalks and 8 miles of bike trails. Around 10 ton of grass seed and about 3,000 yards of sod and turf is installed and planted on the National Mall.

OLD FAITHFUL NATIONAL STONE

On average Old Faithful eruptions reach between 130 and 140 feet, although, It has measured over 180 foot high. The water vent has been measured as high as 203 degrees Fahrenheit.
